EARLY WARNING SYSTEM (EWS) – in the framework of the CroCoos project – is a systematic tool used by educational institutions at institutional level, based on measurable data and observable phenomena, facilitating the timely identification of students at risk of dropping out and also the establishment and application of tailor made prevention measures on an individual level. The operation of an EWS system is based on such institutional and teacher competencies like gathering and processing appropriate data interpreting students' behaviour and the reasons behind, establishing tailor made prevention measures and readiness to involve out-of-school resources and partners.

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
